He recently studied and toured with *Viver Brazil*, an Afro-Brazilian performing company based in Los Angeles, California, throughout Alabama on their "*Samba In The Streets*" tours in February, 2018 and February, 2020. He is presently serving as an In-resident Artist at the Alabama School of Fine Arts in Birmingham, AL.
